





CII & CII Foundation Kerala Rehabilitation Initiative

PROJECT UPDATEAUGUST 2020

BACKGROUND

Kerala witnessed the most devastating floods that wreaked havoc in the state causing massive damage to both life and livelihoods. Post the immediate relief measures for the victims of the floods, CII and CII Foundation (CIIF), in joint consultation with the State Government of Kerala undertook interventions to supplement the Government's efforts for "Nava Keralam".

Rehabilitation Initiatives where designed to bring about a perceptible change in the lives of people by building ecological and technical safeguards for improved/increased resilience, high standards of quality, thereby improving access to services and outreach to the marginalized sections of the society in the most affected geographies.

Post several discussions and meeting with different Government Departments and Senior officials, support towards Education and Health was identified as a priority area. A detailed survey and data collection on the damaged Schools and Health facilities was undertaken in coordination with district administration. The findings were submitted to the National CII Task Force on Kerala Flood Relief and Rehabilitation, Co-Chaired by Mr. Kris Gopalakrishnan, Past President, CII & Dr. Naushad Forbes, Past President, CII. The committee approved

restoration of public infrastructure for Education & Health in the Districts of Ernakulam and Thrissur.

A four Member CII & CIIF Rehabilitation Committee comprising of senior industry members from the region was constituted to provide strategic guidance for rolling out the rehabilitation interventions. The committee approved construction of one school that was declared unfit (Govt.Lower Primary School (GLPS), Kayanad) and six Public Health Centres (North Paravoor, Moothakunnam, Chittattukara, Puthuvype, Mulavukadu, and Avoly) for renovation / construction, with an annual outreach of approx. 5 lakh direct beneficiaries under the initiative.

The Committee also selected/approved The Centre of Science and Technology for Rural Development (COSTFORD) as the implementation partner.

MoUs for the 6 Health Centres and the 1 primary school were signed on 20th November 2019.

Field visits, extensive interaction with community, local authorities, school & hospital management, design experts, etc., were undertaken for developing and finalizing of the designs for the identified interventions.

GOVT. LOWER PRIMARY SCHOOL, KAYANADU

Govt. Lower Primary School, Kayandu, is the only lower primary school in the Marady Panchayat. It was damaged and declared unfit by the Local Self Government Department (LSGD) Engineer. Presently, the school is functioning out of a rented building.

Proposed Interventions:

- Complete reconstruction of the school building.
- 6 Classrooms, toilet block and administrative rooms in ground floor. First floor to have one multipurpose room.

- Plinth beam works in progress.
- Additional features Barrier free enabling structures such as ramps, disabled-friendly toilets, Bio gas plant and wastewater treatment unit.

Status:

- Construction commenced on 13th March 2020 in the presence of Mrs. Latha Sivan, Panchayat President, Marady Grama Panchayat.
- RCC and coloumn works completed upto plinth level.
- Foundation work completed.

PRIMARY HEALTH CENTRE, CHITTATUKARA

Chittatukara Primary Health Center is one of the oldest in the region / taluk / panchayat and caters to health care requirements to nearly 25,000 people.

The objective of the works is to upgrade the PHC to Family Health centre (FHC) with improved facilities that are eco-friendly and enhance disaster resilience.

Dual Support is being provided

March & April

- 1. Gap Funding To supplement NHM interventions.
- CIIF stand alone support identify & renovate and or construct interventions to upgrade the facility from a Primary Health Centre (PHC) to Family Health Centre (FHC).

Proposed Interventions through CII standalone support interventions:

- Upgrade the facility into a Family Health Centre with the following facilities such as Yoga hall/Conference hall, Waiting area and construction of new toilets.
- Integrating components of Disaster resilience and barrier free structures.

Status:

- Gap Funding:
 - Refurbishment of observation rooms, Nursing Station and construction of new toilets and modification of existing toilets completed.
- CIIF Direct support:
 - Presently, Toilet masonry work reached upto lintel level, frames of doors and windows fixed, steel staircase for entry to the first floor also completed.

PRIMARY HEALTH CENTER, AVOLI

Government of Kerala has selected PHC Avoly for upgrading the existing PHC to FHC. It is one of the most preferred and only PHC in this area catering to the health needs of the people.

Proposed Interventions:

- Improving the Healthcare facilities and transition of the Hospital to a 'safe and green Hospital'.
- Construction of Biomedical waste management unit and infrastructural facilities for Immunization room such as passage and waiting area.

Status:

- Foundation work of the Bio-Medical Waste Management Unit completed.
- The truss works of the waiting area is progressing.

PRIMARY HEALTH CENTRE, PUTHUVYPPU

Puthuvyppu is one of the densely populated inlands in the state. The PHC is the only Government health centre in the Panchayat. The building was totally damaged in the floods and was declared unfit. Presently the PHC is functioning in a temporary shelter in the compound.

Proposed Interventions:

 Construction of new building that is eco-friendly, energy efficient and disaster resilient catering to the emerging health care needs of the people and Family Health Centre.

Status:

- Designs and Structural Estimates are finalised.
- The demolition of the unfit building completed.

PARAVOOR TALUK, HEADQUARTER HOSPITAL

Paravoor Taluk Hospital one of the major hospitals and only Government hospital in the Taluk.

- Transform the facility to a 'safe and green Health centre' and with improved resilience.
- Refurbishment of wards, Pharmacy and construction of toilets.

Status:

- MoUs signed and mobilisation advance transferred for commencing works.
- Refurbishment works for the Hospital ward have commenced.
